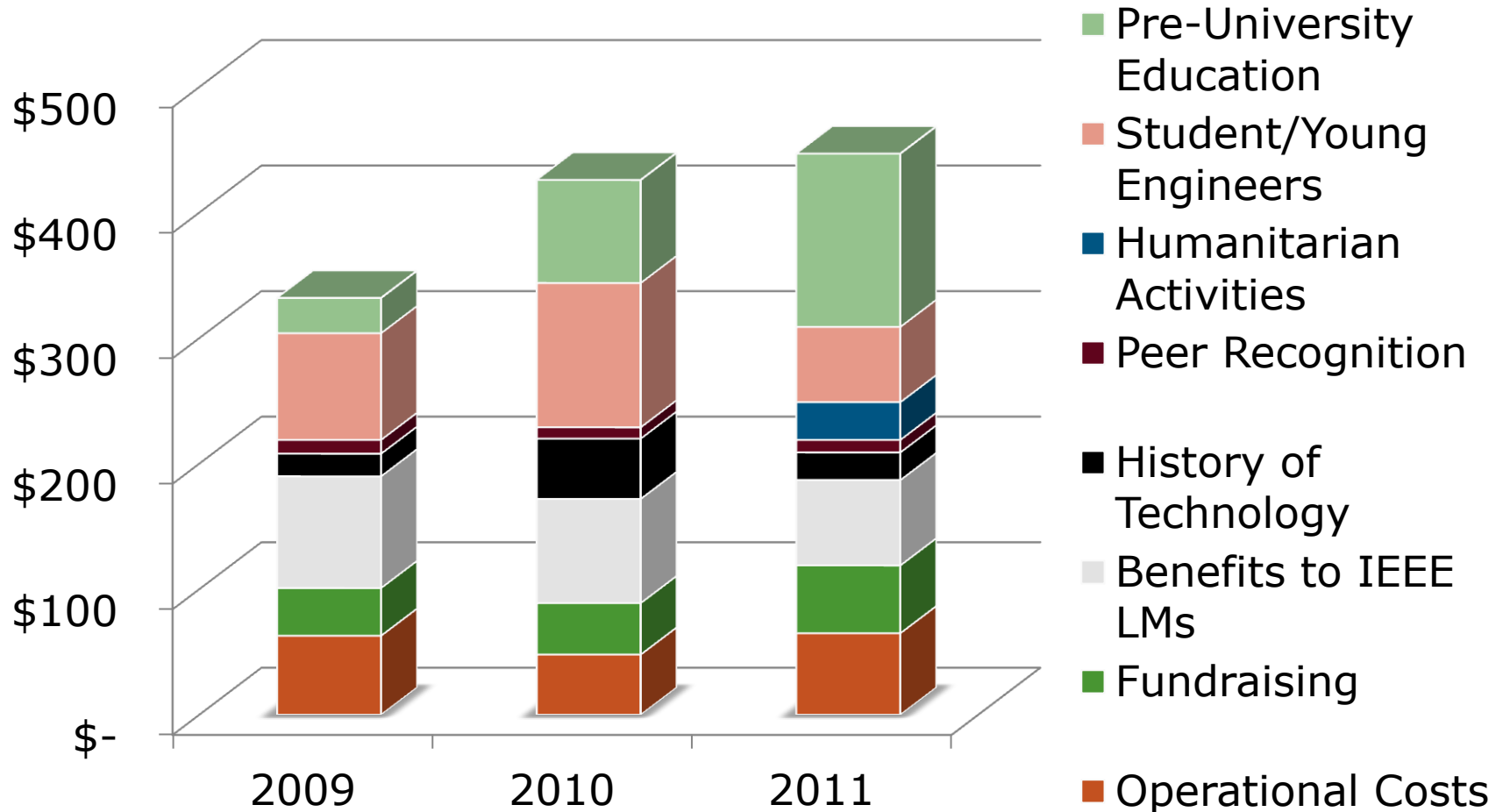

Admiral Hooper Recordings Transcription Project

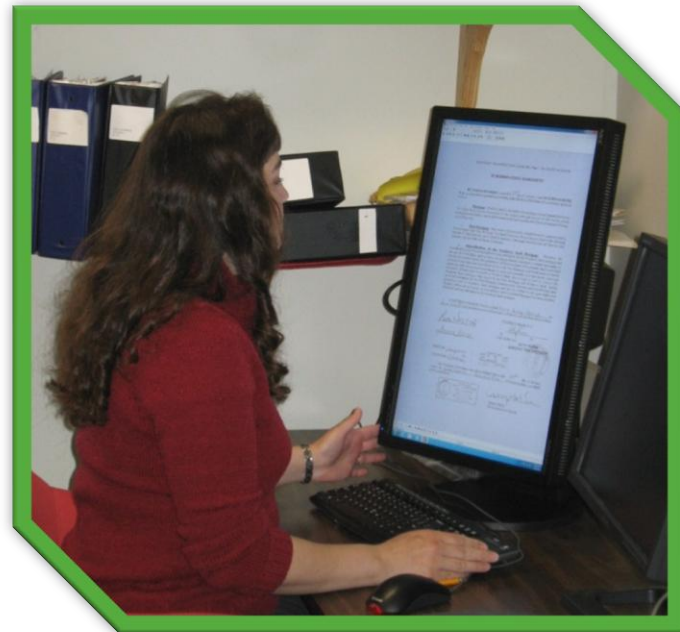

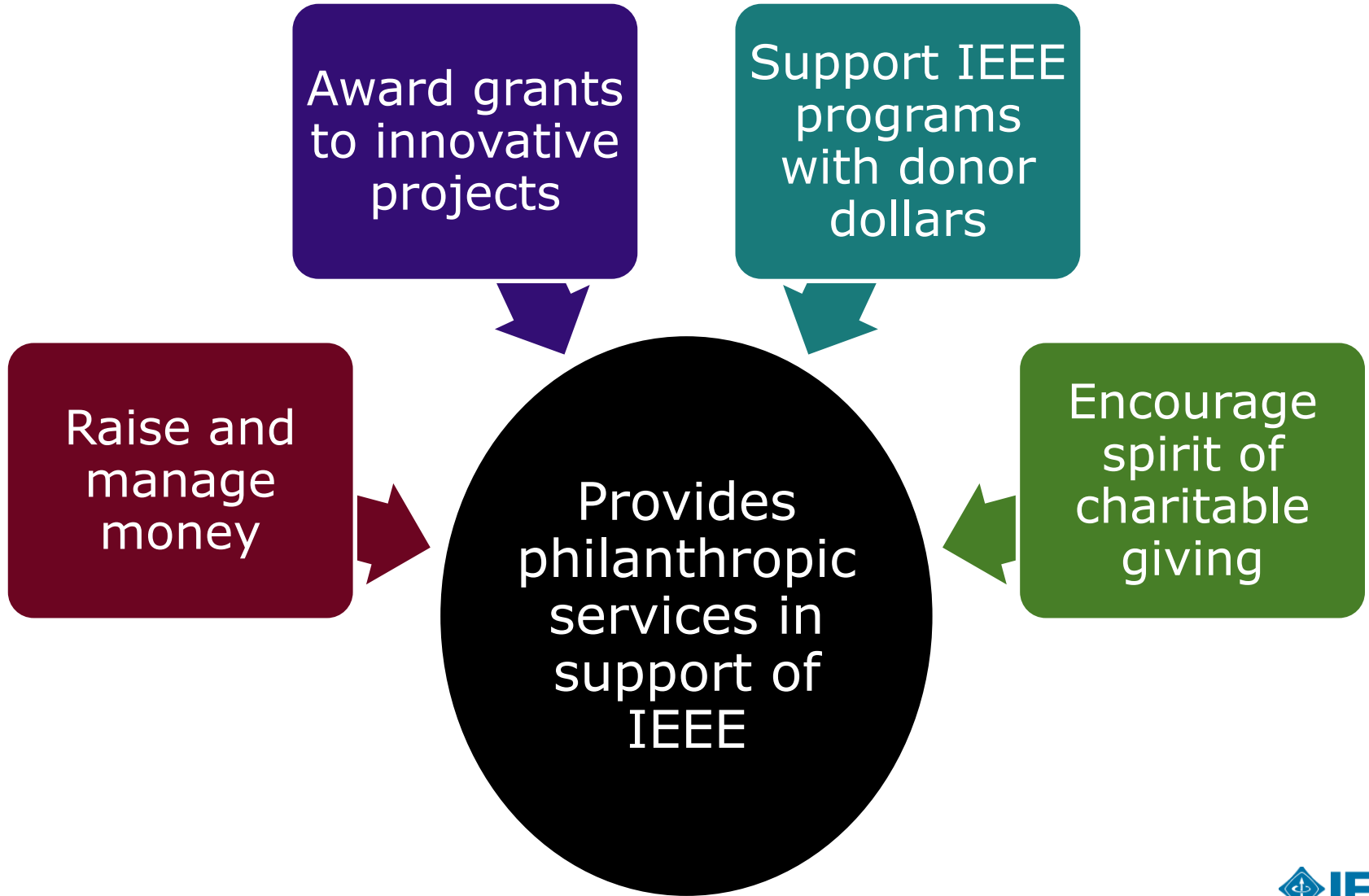
