Topic: Group Decision Methods

Abstract: How can you resolve differences when the interests, opinions and values of individuals differ? This presentation will provide an introduction to some effective structured processes that can improve the overall quality of a group decision. The presentation begins with a review of voting systems and the interesting determination that all ranked voting systems are flawed. This is followed by an introduction to three structured group processes: Delphi method, Prediction Markets and Decision Conferencing. Meeting attendees will be able to: 1) Learn about different voting systems such as instant-runoff and approval voting 2) Understand flaws in voting as demonstrated in the Condorcet Paradox. 3) Appreciate the advantages of *structured* as opposed to *unstructured* group processes 4) Use

prediction markets to, among other things, gauge President Obama's re-election chances and 5) Consider the strengths and limitations of three structured group processes.



Speaker: Julius Chang, Eng.Sc.D., P.E. is a Lecturer in the Civil Engineering Department of the Columbia University School of Engineering and Applied Science, where he teaches a course on decision models. He also serves as a risk analyst for STV.





Topic: Matunda Water Project in Kenya

Abstract: The Matunda Water Project, led by a multidisciplinary team from the New York City professional Chapter of Engineers without Borders (EWB-USA), aims to provide clean potable water for the Matunda Health Centre (MHC) located in Matunda, Kenya. This project's objectives were: clean water to the MHC, to educate the local community in the management, operation and maintenance of the water system, and to conduct monitoring and evaluation of the impacts on the health of the MHC users over the life of the project.

Engineers without Borders-USA (EWB-USA) is a national non-profit volunteer organization consisting of industry professionals and university students, whose goal is to design and implement sustainable technologies in under-resourced communities around the world with the intent of improving their quality of life and to provide a capacity to meet their basic human needs.

Speakers: Iana Aranda is a Senior Program Manager at Engineering for Global Development, ASME. Her



primary focus is on the development of new technical content in emerging areas and global markets. She serves as Program Manager for Engineering for Change (E4C), a global alliance that facilitates the development of engineering solutions to improve quality of life in under-served communities worldwide. Ms. Aranda has guided the development of E4C's digital platform and driven related partnerships with global technical societies,

NGOs and other organizations at the intersection of technology, design and international development. She has a Bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering from the University of Toronto and a Certificate in Global Affairs from NYU. Ms. Aranda is currently the President of the Engineers Without Borders NY Professional Chapter.
